Pre-Webinar Survey Results

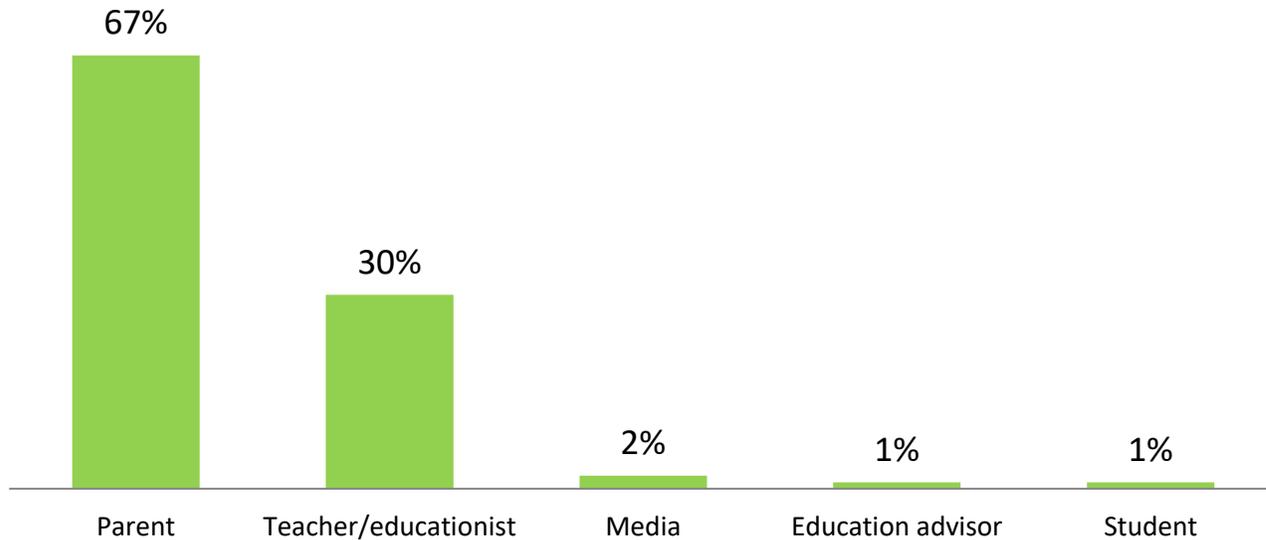
This section of the report summarizes the findings of a survey conducted prior to the webinar

Respondents role and education system



- ❑ The respondents were probed on their role in education and if the education system they represent.
- ❑ Majority of the poll participants were parents (67%).
- ❑ Most of the respondents are from 8-4-4 system of education.

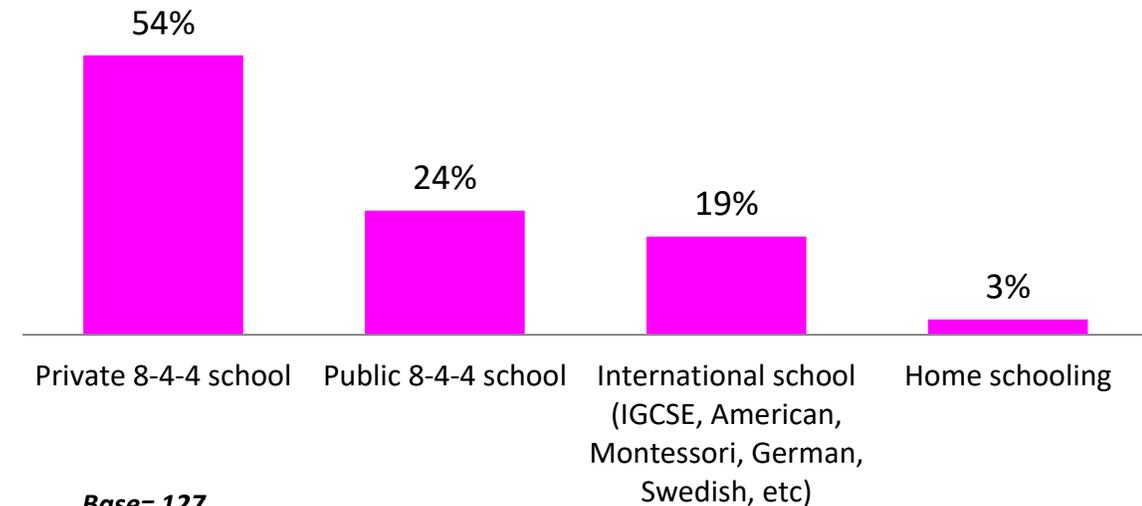
Role in education

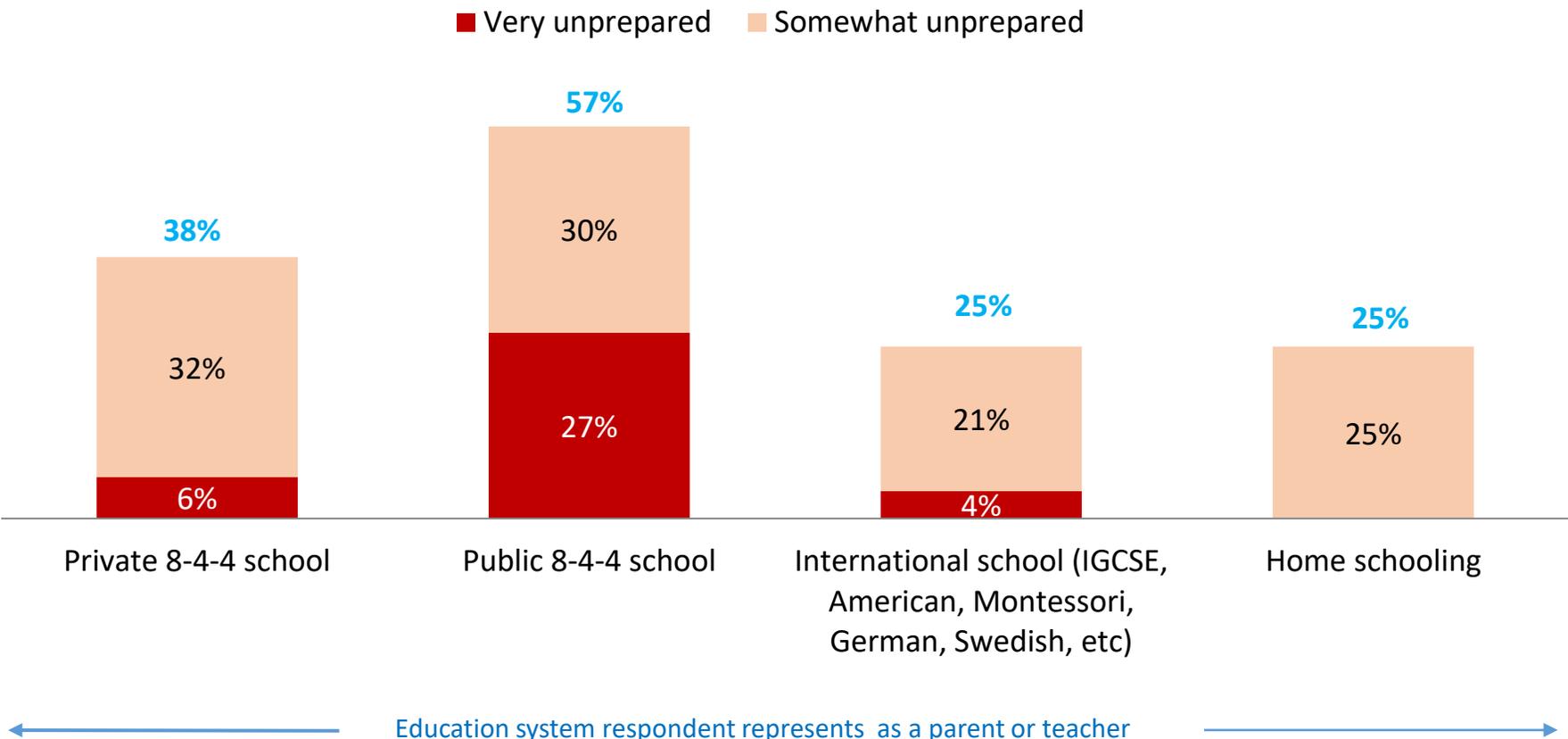
Teachers' preparedness to administer virtual learning (by education system represented)



- ❑ 57% of respondents consider teachers in Public 8-4-4 teachers unprepared
- ❑ 38% of respondents consider teachers in Public 8-4-4 unprepared.
- ❑ 25% of respondents consider teachers in International schools unprepared

Insight: Respondents representing Public 8-4-4 schools consider their teachers to be least prepared to administer virtual learning.

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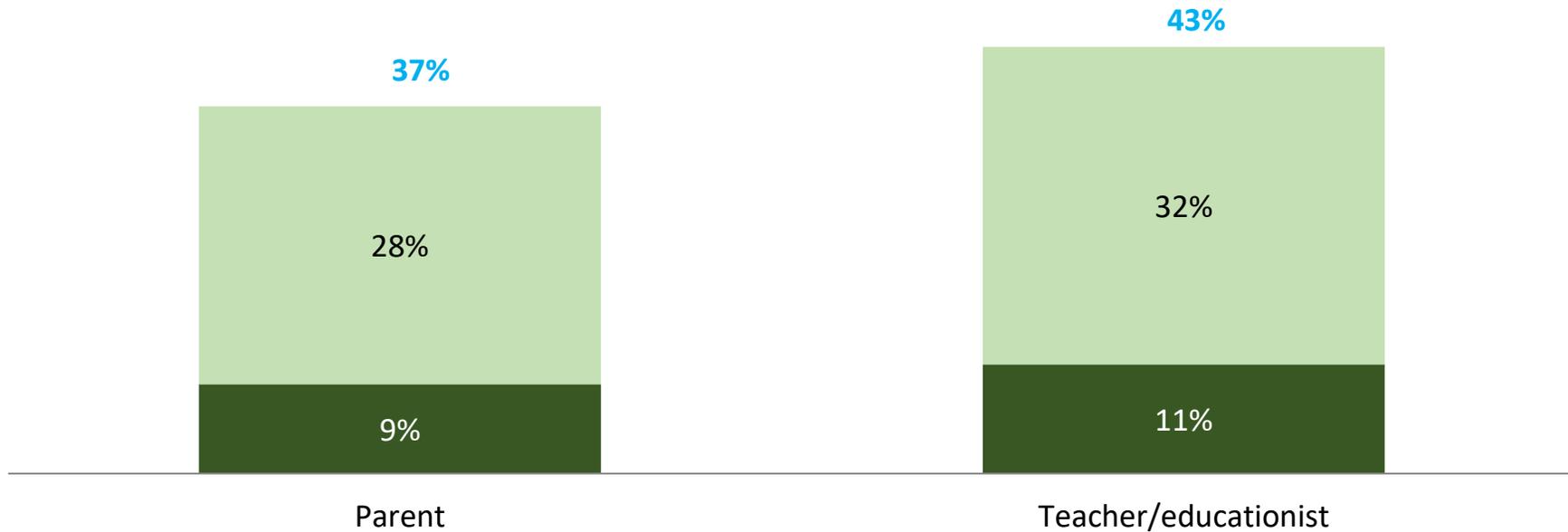
Teachers' preparedness to administer virtual learning (teachers vs parents)

- ❑ 43% of the participating teachers consider themselves unprepared.
- ❑ 37% of parents consider teachers unprepared to administer virtual learning.

Insight: Teachers rate themselves as less prepared to administer virtual learning. This means that teachers have less confidence their ability.

■ Very unprepared ■ Somewhat unprepared



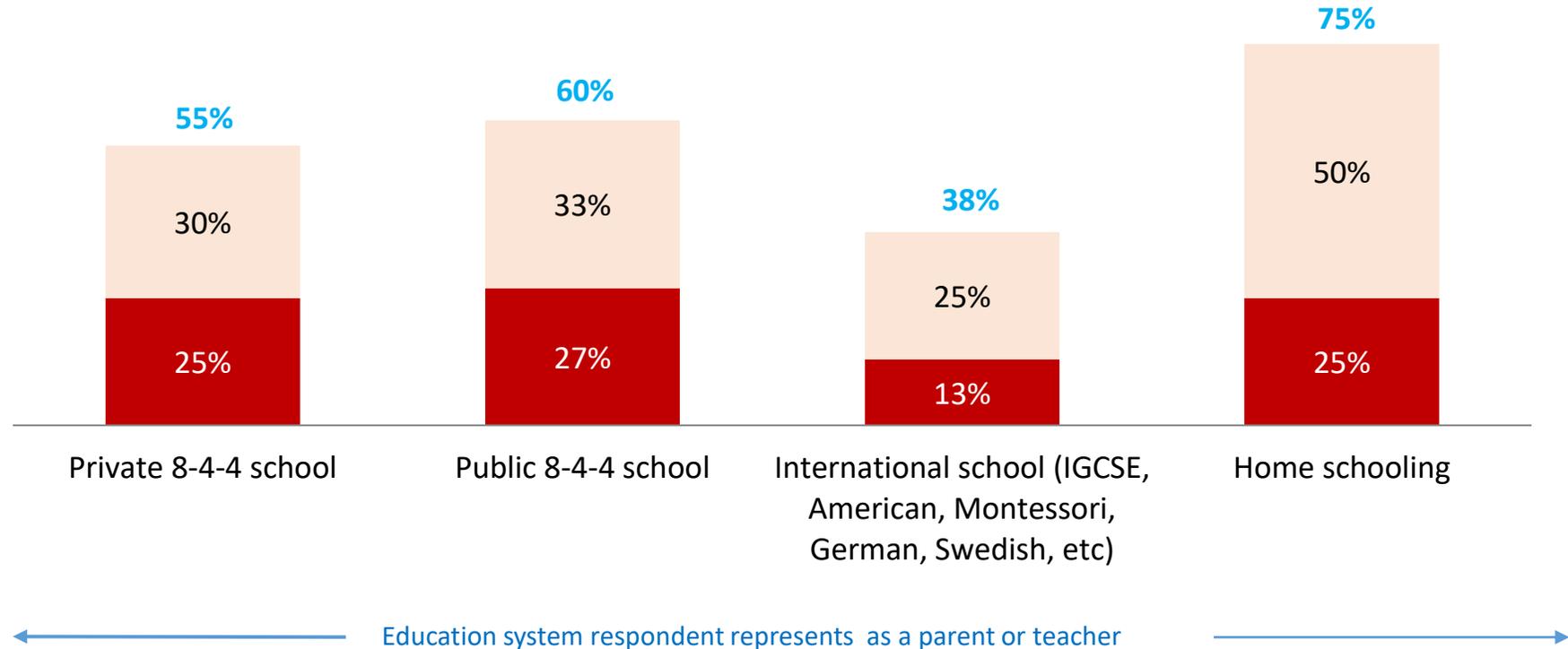
Parents preparedness of support during virtual learning (by education system represented)

- ❑ 60% of teachers in Public 8-4-4 schools unprepared.
- ❑ 55% of teachers in Private 8-4-4 Schools unprepared.
- ❑ 38% of teachers in International schools unprepared.

Insight:
 Respondents representing Public 8-4-4 schools consider their parents to be least prepared to administer virtual learning.

Preparedness of parents to support teachers

■ Very unprepared ■ Somewhat unprepared



Q: How prepared are PARENTS to support teachers and supervise children during virtual learning to children a parent and/or an educationalist?

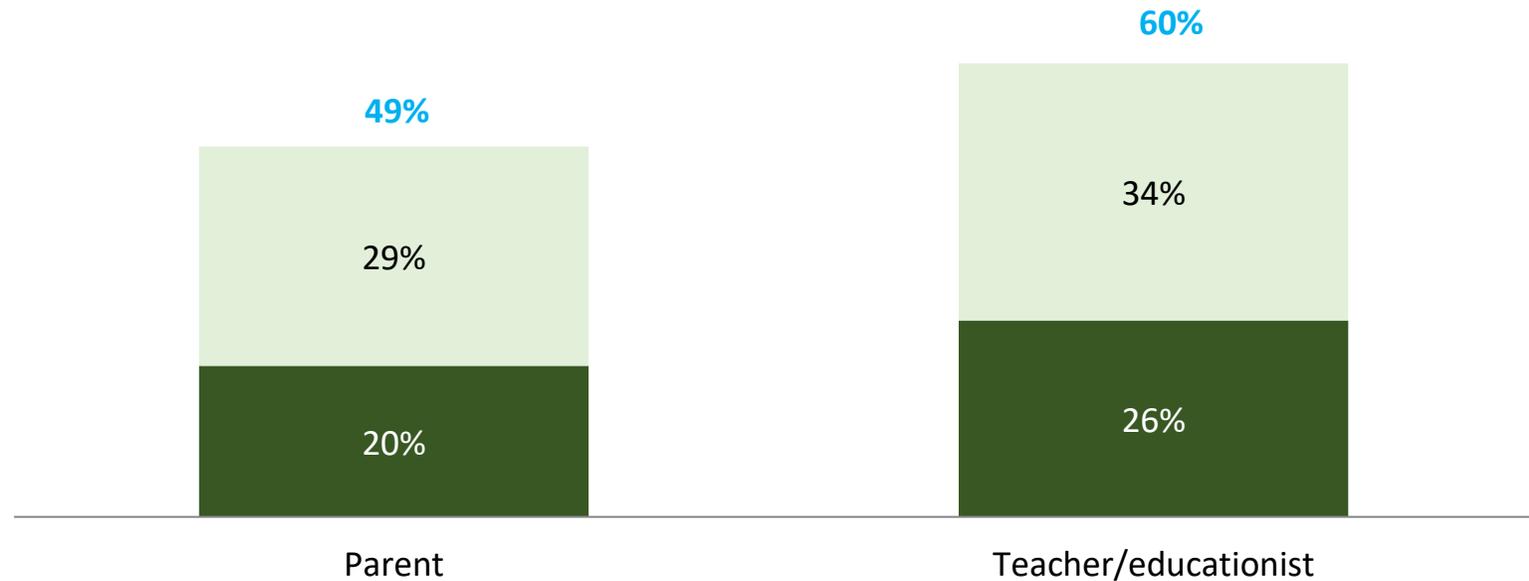
Parents preparedness of support during virtual learning (teachers vs. parents)

- ❑ 49% of parents say that parents are unprepared to support teachers and supervise children.
- ❑ 60% of teachers indicate that parents are unprepared to support teachers and supervise children's' virtual learning.

Insight:
Teachers have less confidence in the preparedness of parents to support virtual learning.

Q: How prepared are PARENTS to support teachers and supervise children during virtual learning to children a parent and/or an educationalist?

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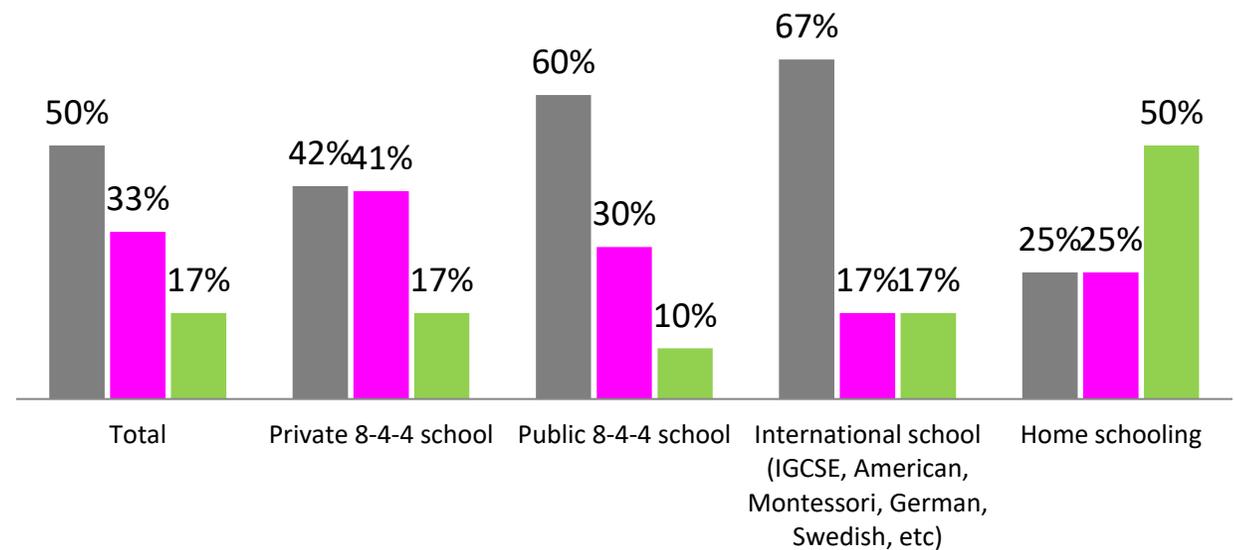
Review and re-organization of the school calendar (by education system represented)

Majority of the respondents would recommend that school re-open to begin a new term in September 2020.

Insight: Public 8-4-4 and International schools are keen to re-open soon.

Review and re-organisation the school calendar

- Begin new school term in September 2020
- Begin new school term after Covid-19 – regardless of how long it takes to contain it
- Begin new school term in January 2021

Review and re-organization of the school calendar (teachers vs. parents)

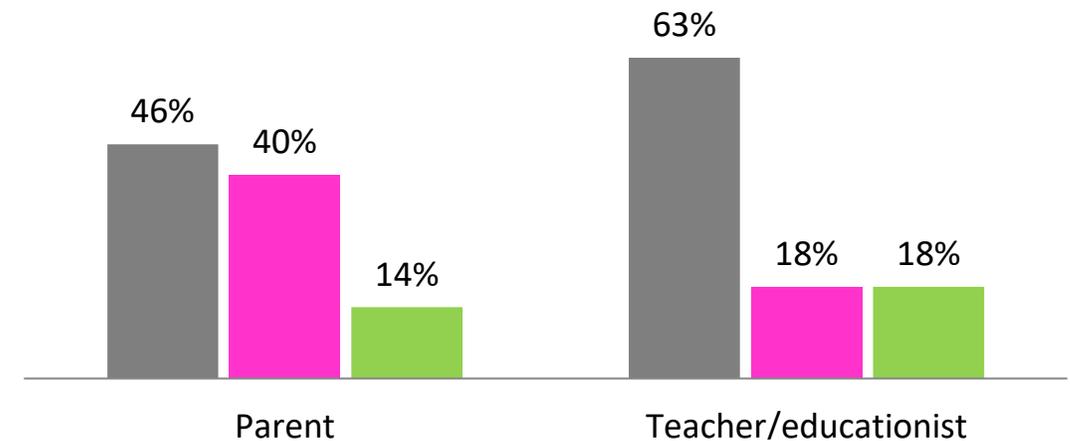
- More teachers than parents recommend that schools reopen in September 2020.

Review and re-organisation the school calendar

Insight:

Teachers more confident about re-opening schools soon. Notably a significant number of parents (46%) do not want children at home.

- Begin new school term in September 2020
- Begin new school term after Covid-19 – regardless of how long it takes
- Begin new school term in January 2021

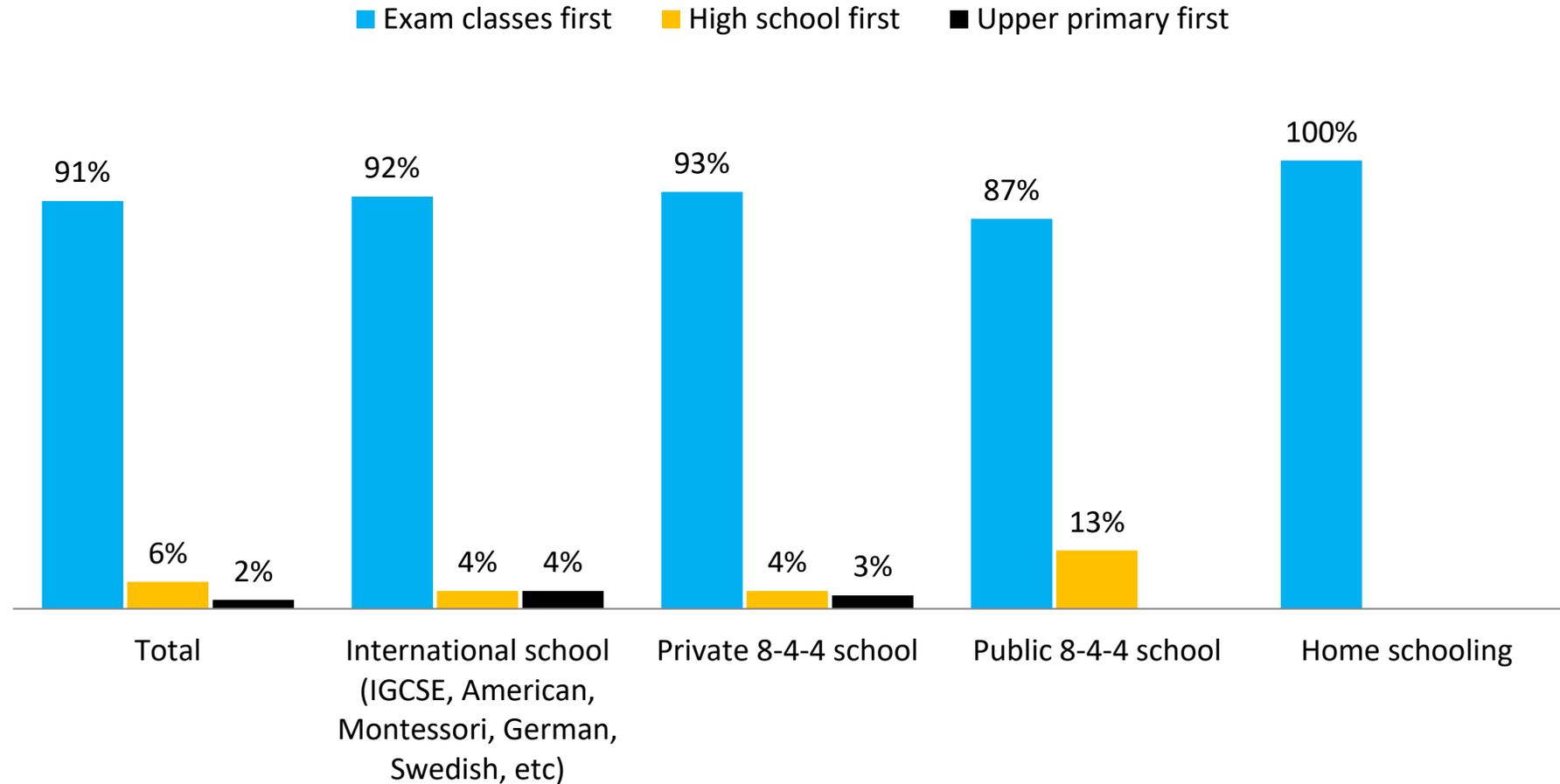
Priority groups for re-opening boarding schools



- ❑ In all schooling systems, parents, teachers and other educationalists think that exam class should resume first when school re-opens.
- ❑ High school students should then resume before upper primary students.

Insight:
There is universal support for those sitting for examinations to be given priority for re-opening.

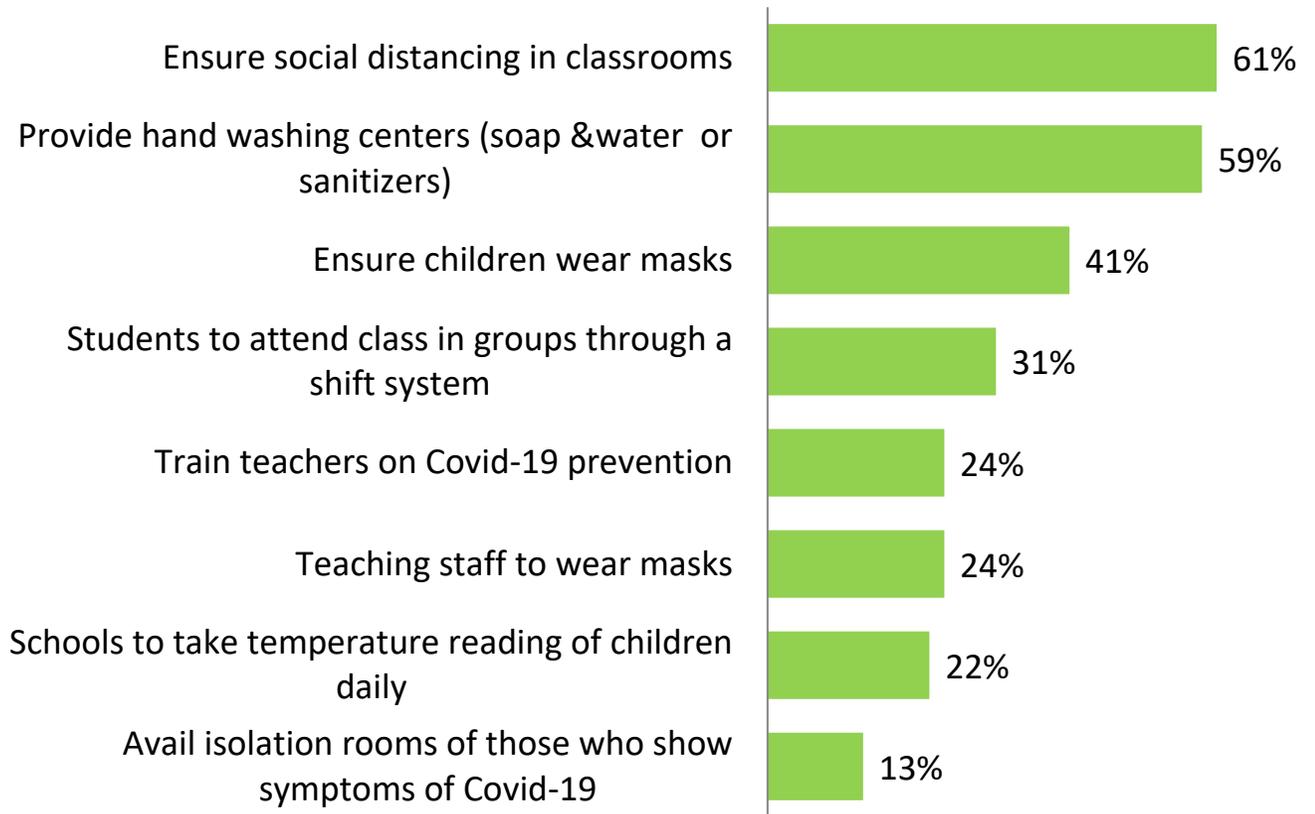
Ensuring safe teaching and learning environment (by total)

- Ensuring social distancing and providing hand washing centers with soap or sanitizers are the most proposed measures to ensure safe learning environment in schools.

Insight:

Social distancing may be a challenge for those schools with high populations. Low mentions of training teachers on Covid-19 prevention is worrying considering that they will be in regular and extended contact with the school children

Proposed measures to ensure safe environment (top 3 measures mentioned)



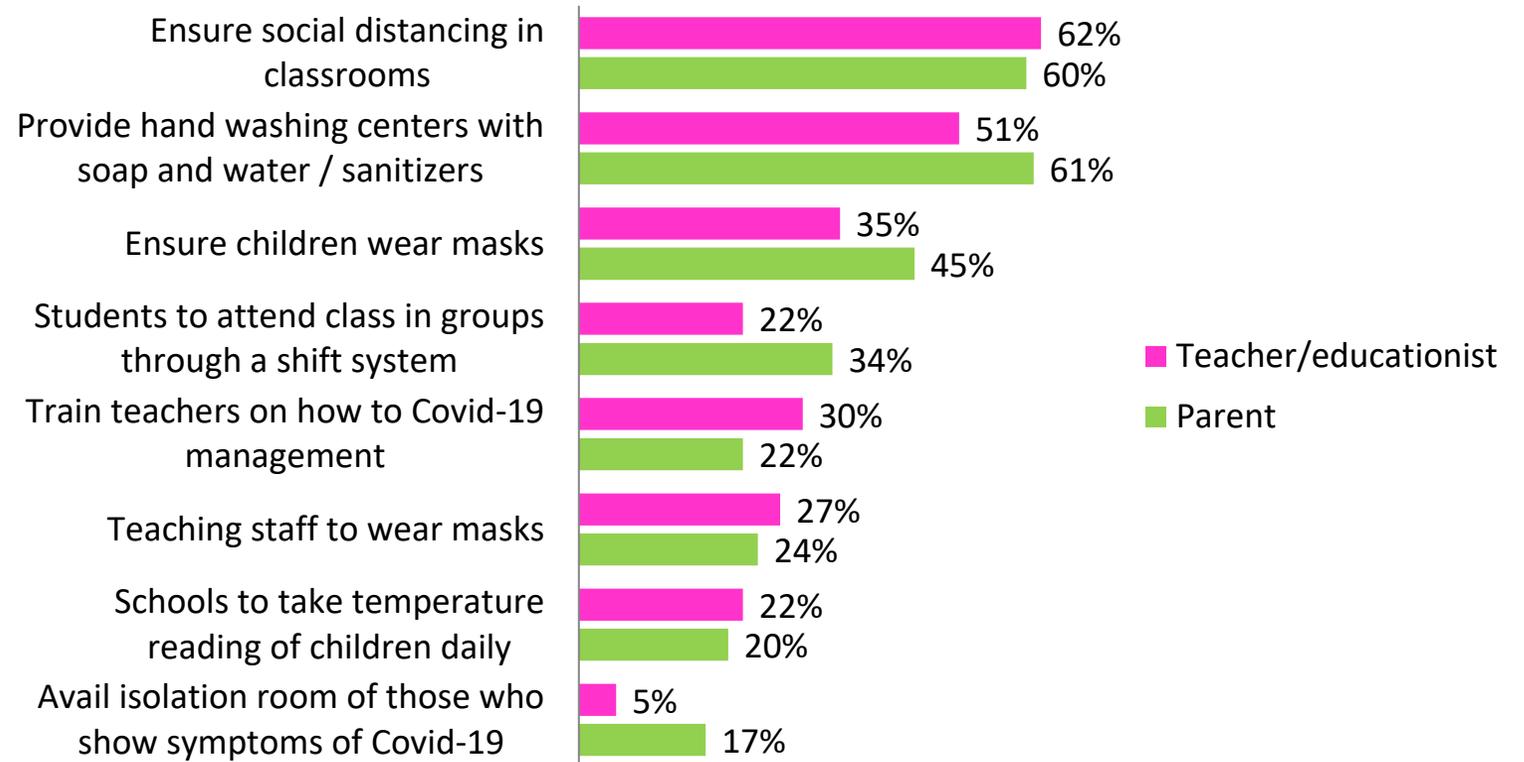
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Ensuring safe teaching and learning environment (teachers vs. parents)

- ❑ For teachers, the measures with the highest mentions to ensure safe learning environment in schools is to ensure social distancing
- ❑ Providing hand washing centers with soap or sanitizers is the most proposed measure by parents to ensure safe learning environment in schools.

Insight: Parents have higher mentions of most prevention measures as compared to teachers. As expected, they are more concerned about the safety of their children.

Assuming that the Covid-19 risk continues being present in Kenya, what would be the best option for schools in terms of opening?

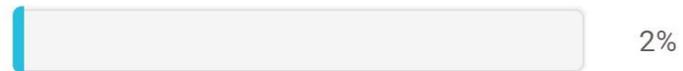
Schools to re-open once safety measures have been put in place



Schools to remain closed until the disease is eliminated or a vaccine found



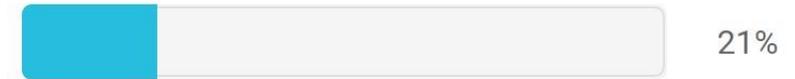

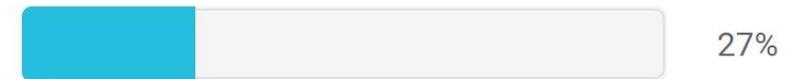
- ❑ At least half the sample feel examinations should be postponed due to Covid-19 challenges and uncertainties.

If you were to advise on the review and re-organisation the school calendar as part of the COVID-19 post recovery strategy, which option would you recommend for EXAMS?

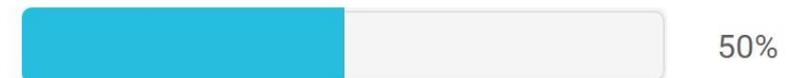
Conduct examinations virtually

Data collection methodology

Pre-webinar survey

- ❑ This is a rapid assessment survey conducted with stakeholders in the education sector.
- ❑ Data collection was done through an online survey link. The sampling was purposive as the link was sent through various networks through SMS, WhatsApp and email.

In-Webinar Survey

- ❑ The webinar participants were surveyed live during the webinar session. This was done midway through the webinar session. The findings give an indication of what their sentiments are on topical issues on education and Covid-19

Methodology caution

- ❑ Due to the purposive sampling, the sample is not fully representative of the parents and teaching population in the whole of Kenya. However, the findings are indicative of the sentiments on education.



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
